- To establish a committee of administrators, faculty, and service providers to review the current status of our district plan for academic support programs and make recommendations for improvements for Multi-tiered Support Services.
- To implement a full day co-teaching model at the elementary level.
- To establish a strategic list of priority needs that identifies outstanding items from the NYS mandated Visual Inspections in 2022 as the basis of establishing a five-year capital improvement plan.

There is so much ahead of us, and I am ecstatic to be a part in helping accomplish these goals with you all!

When not in school, Mr. Murphy likes to read. He really reads a lot. He has also recently returned to running after a hiatus.








PATRICK WALSH, ED. D. PRINCIPAL OF SOUTH SIDE HIGH SCHOOL






Covert was recognized by the USTA (United States Tennis Association) at their annual awards dinner on September 20, 2022 at Chateau Briand in Carle Place.





Covert's tennis program was part of a special initiative to enrich students through a non-traditional curriculum, called "Enrichment Clusters". The "Enrichment Clusters" were facilitated by Covert teachers Chris Zappia, Lynn Woods, and Antoinette Morgan.

South Side High School students earn gold medals in local ACT-SO Fair

The Afro-Academic, Cultural, Technological, Scientific Olympics (ACT-SO) Fair is a subsidiary of the NAACP



Two South Side High School students earned gold in the Long Island Academic, Cultural, Technological, & Scientific Olympics (ACT-SO) Fair.

ACT-SO is a subsidiary of the NAACP and brings together high school kids from across the United States to compete in 33 possible areas of study, ranging from STEM, to the humanities, the arts, and culinary.

Through ACT-SO, students train with mentors for the local level of competition. Those that win a gold medal at the local level move on to the national competition.

This year, the national convention took place in Atlantic City.

Delyse Rios, a senior from South Side High School in Rockville Centre, won a gold medal for her biochemistry project at the local level, taking her to the national level in Atlantic City, where she won a bronze medal.

Her project, titled "Assessing Hydrogen and Halogen Bonding Strength in Simple Organic Molecules," examined the relative strengths and usefulness of hydrogen and halogen bonding, and how these compounds bind to proteins in relation to various pharmaceuticals.

Aurelie Maurice, another senior from South Side High School, earned a gold medal in Poetry (Performance) for the local level.

"The poem that I wrote was essentially about my brother. For a lot of years, I spent a lot of time taking care of my brother and he recently moved to Florida," Aurelie Maurice explained. "I wasn't really able to vocalize my feelings any other way so randomly one night, I was like this is what I want to write about."

Both seniors were quick to credit Mr. Weiss, the director of science research at South Side High School, for their confidence and interest in pursuing STEM careers.

"If I had to credit anybody, it would be Mr. Weiss," Delyse Rios said. "He was like, 'I see something in you, we are going to have you in everything' and he started to incorporate us in many organizations, including ACT-SO. Over time, I realized how much potential he saw in me and, in turn, I was able to see it in myself."


"Mr. Weiss does not get enough praise for what he does for his students," Aurelie Maurice added. "He goes above and beyond, he makes sure that every student that he has is taking care of, and seen, and given lots of opportunities. He really is amazing."

SSHS teacher's paintings accepted into 2022 Biennial exhibition

The 2022 Long Island Biennial features artwork by 57 contemporary artists from across Nassau & Suffolk counties.



An art teacher with the Rockville Centre School District is having his paintings featured in the 2022 Long Island Biennial at the Heckscher Museum of Art.

The 2022 Long Island Biennial features artwork by 57 contemporary artists on Long Island communities stretching from Freeport to Huntington to Sag Harbor. 723 artwork entries were received this year, with 95 selected for exhibition - including two painted by Keith Gamache.

"These two that were selected are actually ones that I made in the very beginning of the pandemic, when schools shut down," Keith Gamache explains. "So they were also something, especially those first two weeks when we closed and we didn't know what was going on. Are we coming back in two weeks? Are we not coming back at all? What's going on? So, the paintings also became a way for me to just stay connected with my students."

Keith said he would encourage his students to send him pictures of what they were working on and that he would do the same. As time went on and the schools began to utilize Google Meet and Zoom, Keith would host 'open studios with Mr. Gamache.'


During these open studio sessions, Keith would be at his dining room table with his paints and he would have conversations with his students while he worked on his paintings, and they worked on their projects. "Anything to try and make those connections," Keith said.

"I ended up doing five COVID-related paintings over the next two years," Keith explained. "The first two were accepted as part of this exhibition so I called them COVID-19 Volume 1 and Volume 2."

Keith Gamache makes his paintings on Masonite pegboards. He paints circles around the holes and connects holes together with different lines.

"For the longest time, they were almost purely geometric abstractions," Keith said. "Then I started to work with text. This was the first time I blended some kind of image with my text. So, one of the texts is 'social distancing' and the other is 'isolated painting.' The images are my symbolic interpretations of the virus inspired by pictures being released as parts of news stories."

The 2022 Long Island Biennial at the Heckscher Museum of Art will be open to the public from October 1, 2022 up until January 22, 2023.
